Course Description

In this course students will explore all aspects involved in the production of a play. Their focus will be concentrated on interpretation, performance, and stagecraft. In addition to reading a variety of plays, students will also determine how best to present the play. They will spend class time in rehearsal and in stage, costume and properties preparation. As their major project, students will present a full length play in front of an audience.

- Weeks 3 - 10 Rehearsal, Set Construction, Prop and Costume Preparation
- Week 11 Final Preparation, Dress Rehearsals and Performances
- Week 12 Set Strike, Cleaning and Choosing One Act Play
- Weeks 13 - 18 Preparing One Act Play for competition

Major Projects

During the course of the semester, students will prepare and present a full length and fully staged play in front of an audience and a fully staged One Act play for MSHSL competition.
